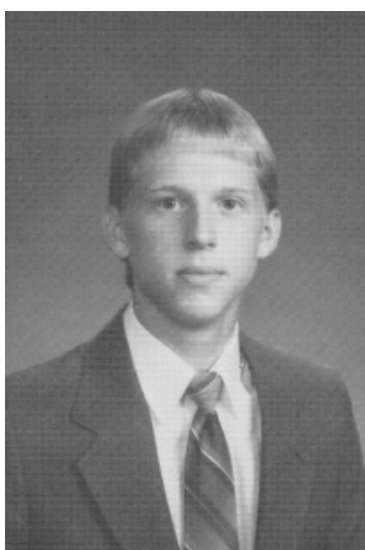
Baseball Preview
